In extending our best wishes this holiday season, may we say that our thoughts are with you all, as they shall continue to be in the days to come.

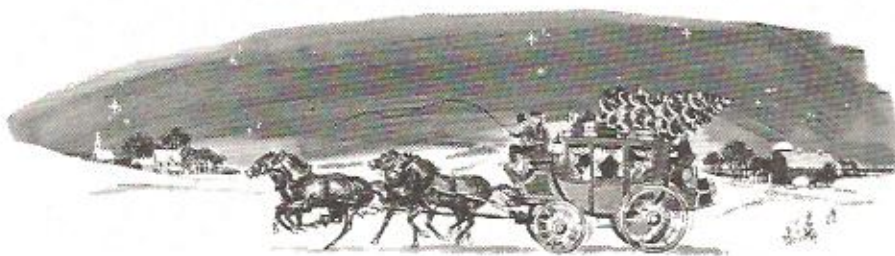
