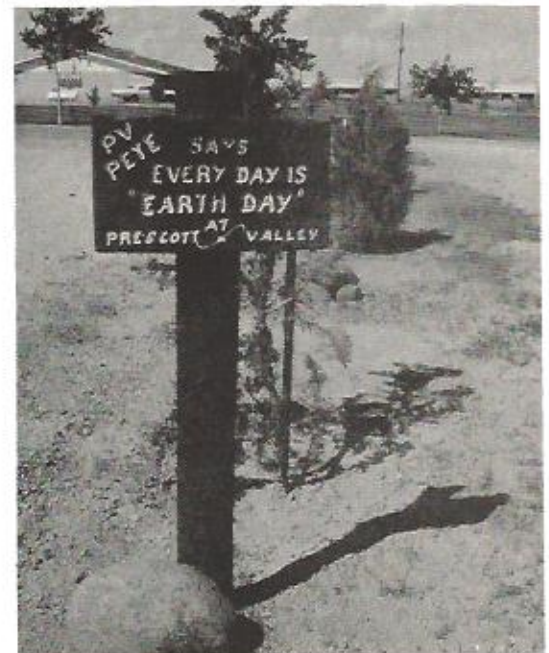
*And A Vocabulary Lesson.....*

Young John, trained in their Rookie League this summer and is scheduled to report for spring training at St. Petersburg, Florida, next March.

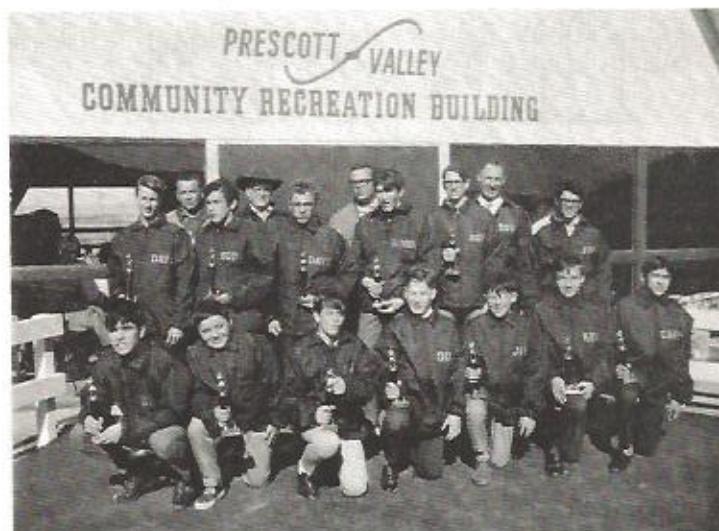
When asked if it was all he had expected, John nodded, "Yes ... and it's hard work too!"

## Recipe Of The Month

Ingredients:

- 1 pound ground beef
- 1 medium sized onion
- 1 can green beans
- 1 can tomato soup
- mashed potatoes
- butter
